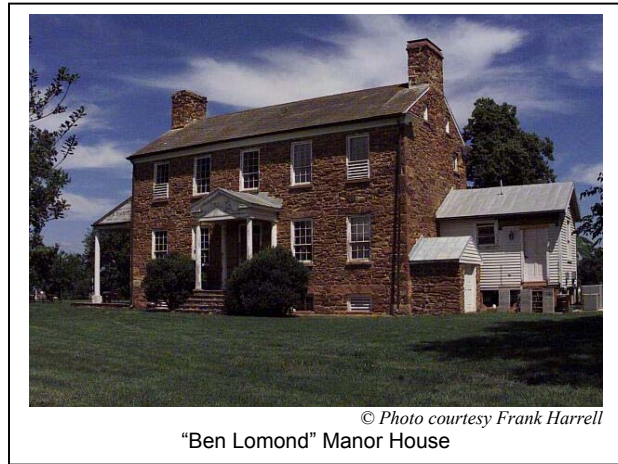

THE CHINN FAMILY OF BEN LOMOND

Many times as I have tended to my adopted rose bed behind the “Ben Lomond” manor house people who are visiting the garden would ask “Do you know who Ben Lomond was?” Well, there was no person named Ben Lomond that built or owned the manor house.

The manor house was built in 1832 by Benjamin Tasker Chinn (1807-1886), who descended from his great, great grandfather Robert “King” Carter (1663-1732), great grandfather Robert Carter II (1704-1732) grandfather Robert “Councillor” Carter (1728-1804), and mother Sarah Fairfax Carter (1773-1829) who married Dr. John Yates Chinn (1770-1830) of Richmond County, Virginia. Benjamin, a bachelor, brought seven slaves with him when he moved to western Prince William County onto the 730 acres, part of Cancer farm, spanning both sides of the Bull Run, that he inherited from his mother, Sarah Fairfax Carter in 1830, after the death of his father. Benjamin Tasker Chinn was named for his great grandfather on his mother’s side, Benjamin Tasker (1690-1768) governor of Maryland and many

times Mayor of Annapolis, where he and his wife Ann Bladen resided.

On January 26, 1838 Benjamin Tasker Chinn, at age 31, married the lovely 25-year-old Edmonia Randolph Carter (1813-1895), twice a second cousin, daughter of Landon and Courtenay Norton Carter of “Woodland” located across the Bull Run in Loudoun County. She was named for her uncle Edmond Jennings Randolph, eighth governor of Virginia, husband of her mother’s sister, Elizabeth Carter.

A story told by Edmonia’s grandson, William “Bailey” Tyler, of “The Shelter” in Prince William County, was that his grandmother, upon marrying Benjamin Chinn, did not like the property being referred to as the “Cancer Farm.” Therefore she named the house “Ben Lomond” after a favorite 3,000 acre Randolph family estate, “Ben Lomond,” built in 1736 in Goochland County. “Ben” means mountain and the house name came from Ben Lomond or Mt. Lomond on the banks of Loch or Lake Lomond in Scotland. The second verse of the song “The Bonnie Banks O’ Loch Lomond” reads:

“’Twas there that we parted in yon shady glen,
On the steep, steep, side o’ Ben Lomond,
Where in purple hue the Highland hills we view,
and the moon coming out in the gloamin.”

The farms were originally named by Robert “Councillor” Carter after inheriting 70,000 acres of property from his father, of which 41,660 acres were located around western Prince William, Loudoun and Fairfax Counties, that were known as the Bull Run tract. Dividing his property into 15 separate farms and plantations, Robert Carter named 12 of his

farms after the signs of the zodiac. The “Leo” and “Cancer” farms, part of the Bull Run and Goose Creek tracts, were inherited by three of his seventeen children, Priscilla (1760-1823), Sarah Fairfax (1773-1829) and youngest son George Carter (1777-1846) when their father died in 1804.

George inherited 5,000 acres with a majority of the property in the Bull Run and Goose Creek tracts. He and his wife, Elizabeth Grayson Carter, began building their family home “Oatlands” in Loudoun County in 1804 on 1,000 acres, part of the Goose Creek tract. He subdivided and sold most of the Bull Run tract to family members, including the property which is

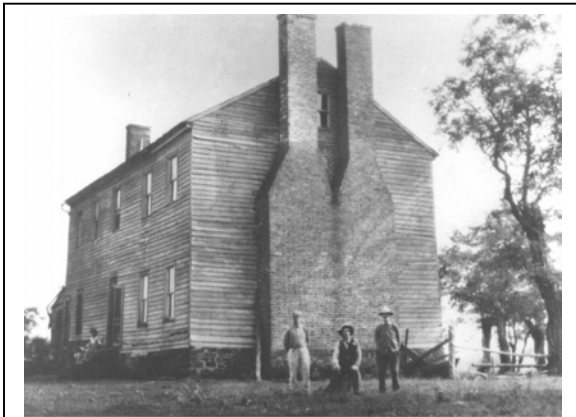
now the Manassas National Battlefield.

In 1823, Priscilla willed a 1,200 acre section of the “Cancer farm” to her son, Richard Tasker Mitchell, who moved into an existing structure, and her daughter, Harriet Bladen Mitchell received the balance. Harriet married William James Weir and they built their home “Liberia” around 1829 on their section of the property.

Sarah Fairfax Carter willed 730 acres of her 2,870 acre inheritance to her son, Benjamin Tasker Chinn, which he received after the death of his father in 1830. He completed building his manor house in 1832. There are so many similarities between the interiors of “Liberia” and “Ben Lomond” that one wonders if the same slaves were instrumental in building both homes.

Benjamin Tasker Chinn, before marrying, purchased the adjoining “Cancer farm” property from his cousin, Richard Tasker Mitchell, increasing the “Ben Lomond” property to 1,179.5 acres. He sold 560 acres of the property, which contained a dwelling suitable for a residence, to his sister and her husband, Lovel Marders, a Baptist minister. A short time later the Marders moved to Middleburg, joining many other Chinn relatives, and sold the property back to Benjamin increasing “Ben Lomond” to 1,739.5 acres.

Beginning in 1840 Benjamin Chinn and his cousin Alfred Ball, who had married Edmonia’s sister Sarah, brought Merino sheep to Prince William County. “Ben Lomond” was running 420 head and “Portici”, the Ball farm, was running 230 head of sheep.

In 1850 upon moving into “Hazel Plain” with his family, Benjamin Chinn leased “Ben Lomond” and 1,536 acres to Benjamin Thornton of Orange County, Virginia for \$10,158 over ten years. Mr. Thornton sub-let the property to a British subject, Thomas Pringle for the remainder of the lease. Mr. Pringle continued to run large herds of Merino sheep on the property. In 1854, the Chinns purchased “Hazel Plain” from Benjamin’s older sister Sophia Elizabeth Downman Jones’ estate after moving there in 1850 to care for his ailing sister. This farm consisted of 550 acres and a house that was built in 1809 by Bernard Hooe. They also purchased 198.5 acre “Rock Hall” farm, 1.5 miles north of the Sudley Methodist Church plus a separate piece of land consisting of 9.5 acres on Young’s Branch followed by an additional 10 acres joining Hazel Plain.

During the Civil War years, “Ben Lomond” was known as the “Pringle” house and the existing out building which is referred to as the slave cabin was used as the community’s general store operated by Thomas Pringle. He remained at the manor house during the war years living with his father, Andrew and brother Andrew Jr., even though in 1861 during the First Battle at Manassas the Confederate army used it as a field hospital and camped on the property during the following winter. The Union army secured the property during the Second Battle of Manassas in 1862 where they also used it as a hospital.

By now, Benjamin Chinn owned 15 slaves. His farm "Hazel Plain" was producing, in 1859, 100 bushels of Indian corn, 200 bushels of Oats, 20lbs of Irish potatoes, 150lbs of butter, 18 ton of hay, 10 bushels of grass seed, 140lbs of wool as well as 78 gallons of wine. He kept 6 horses, 24 cows, 2 oxen, 20 swine and 3 sheep. The Battles at Bull Run in 1861 and 1862 were fought around "Hazel Plain" and the house survived both battles. It was also used as a hospital as was any dwelling in the area that had a roof. The Chinn family had left the area during the war years and is assumed to have lived at the Chinn family home, "Edge Hill", in Richmond County, Virginia.

The Chinns had two daughters, Courtenay Norton and Sarah Sophia called Sallie. Courtenay Norton Chinn (1838-1908) married Henry Augustine Tayloe (1836-1908) in October of 1860. They moved to his 2,000 acre family home, Mt. Airy, at Tappahannock, in Essex County, Virginia. They had a total of thirteen children of which ten survived to adulthood. Henry enlisted in the Virginia 40th Infantry, Company B in May of 1861; shortly thereafter he and his wife had their first daughter, Henrietta Ogle Tayloe. He spent most of July and August on sick leave, being discharged in September of 1861. In 1862, a son was born, Benjamin Tasker Tayloe. Several years later he enlisted again, this time with the Virginia 10th Calvary, Company G. His service record ends "NFR" which mean "no further record" to show when a man's service ended with no reason shown.

Sarah Sophia (Sallie) Chinn (1839- 1917) married Robert Horner Tyler (1838-1902) of "Clifton" in Prince William County in March of 1863. Sallie and Robert had twelve children. Their first two sons, Robert Carter Tyler and William "Bailey" Tyler, were born at "The Shelter" and

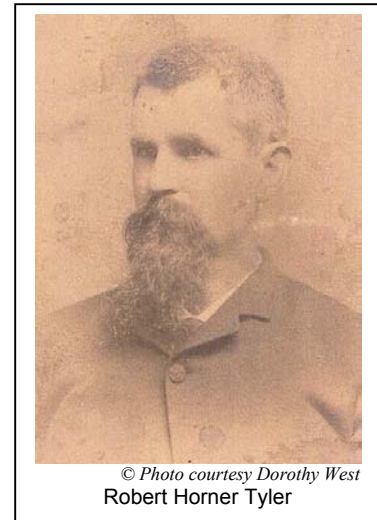
their third child, Benjamin Chinn Tyler was born June 1, 1867 at the "Ben Lomond" manor house. The remainder of their children were born at the "Clifton" manor house.

Soon after Virginia seceded from the Union in 1861, Robert joined the 8th Virginia Infantry, Company C at Haymarket under Captain Edmund Berkeley and they were known as the Bull Run Regulars. They later changed their name to the Evergreen Guard named for the well-loved Berkeley family home. Years after the First and Second Battles of Manassas at Bull Run, many of the Evergreen Guard wished they had retained their old name.

Robert was part of the company highly recognized for winning the one sided battle at Ball's Bluff. Already a veteran of many battles in May of 1863, after a recent promotion and recently married, he was captured by Union forces while visiting his young wife in Richmond County, Virginia. He was sent to Fort La Fayette, where he and General Rooney Lee, General Robert E. Lee's son, were held in solitary confinement for nine weeks as hostages to insure the safety of two Federal officers of similar rank, General Flynn and Captain Sawyer. These two Union officers were under condemnation to be shot in retaliation as two of Mosby's officers had been captured by Union troops and executed as guerillas. The Union army said if their officers were shot, then they would execute Lee and Tyler. It is believed that General Lee and Captain Tyler were selected because of the historical prominence of their family names. For

weeks they lived in hourly expectation of being led out to execution. Captain Tyler was under so much stress in the prison that when he was taken prisoner he weighed 160 lbs.; when he was liberated he weighed 120 lbs, having lost one fourth of his weight. General Robert E. Lee received many an appeal on the behalf of these two brave men. He declined, even for the sake of saving his own son, to interfere with the established principles of war. In March of 1864, at a most critical time, the Confederate President, Jefferson Davis, arranged for the release and exchange of the two Federal prisoners for Lee and Tyler. After having been exchanged, Captain Tyler entered into active service until the surrender at Appomattox. He was captured again at Saylor's Creek in April of 1865 and released on oath in June of 1865 from Johnson's Island prison. He returned home to his beloved wife, his children and his home "The Shelter."

This illustrious family was important to the development of early western Prince William County and were well respected citizens of the community. 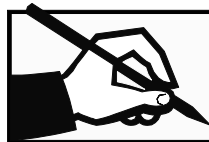

have been Milstead but this seems a strange name for a
woman. I guess it could also have been Mildred. Any
information on this would be exceptionally helpful.

Copies of the 1940's poll tax lists for Prince William County are kept in the manuscript holdings at RELIC. The listings give the person's name with a record of which years of the previous three that taxes were paid; thus the list in 1944 includes the fees paid for 1941-1944. The lists for the years 1944-1949 have been combined and provide a "census" of those who had paid their poll tax 1941-1949.

Reported districts in the Poll Tax Lists for Prince William County are Brentsville (*Prince William Reliquary, Vol. 1, No. 2*), Coles, Dumfries, Gainesville, Manassas District, Occoquan District and Town, and Quantico. Each district for the 1940's decade will be presented in upcoming issues of *Prince William Reliquary*. The Coles District poll tax list follows.

1870 PRINCE WILLIAM CO. AGRICULTURAL CENSUS SCHEDULE INDEX

Transcribed by Beverly Remza Veness

The 1870 index to the Agricultural Schedule for Prince William County, Virginia, includes the first four columns out of a total of 52 columns. Column one gives name of owner, agent or manager of the farm. Column two reports on acres of land improved. Under the heading of unimproved acres, column three is for acres of wood-land and column four for unimproved acreage. Page numbers and line number with their district name and post office designation follows the transcribed four columns.

New information not contained on previous agricultural schedules are: Unimproved acreage is broken down into "Wood-land" and "Other unimproved land". We now find out the "Total amount of wages paid during the year including value of board." Wheat is now broken down into "Spring" and "Winter." Under Dairy, we now find how much milk is being produced under "Milk Sold." Another new column is "Forest Products" [this is probably why the farmers are asked about how much wood-land they have.] The last column is now "Estimated value of all farm production, including betterments and additions to stock." A more detailed description of what the Agricultural Schedules are all about and a listing of all columns can be found in Vol.1, no.1 of *Prince William Reliquary* along with an index to the 1850 Agricultural Schedule. The 1860 index to the Agricultural Schedule can be found in Vol. 1, no. 2.

There is a decline of farms in Prince William County. Comparing the agricultural schedules for census years, there were 605 farms reported in 1850, 582 farms in 1860 and 575 farms in 1870.

The Inventory and appraisal of the Estate of Wm. Hewitt Deced was Returned and ordered to be Recorded.

William Wynn is appointed Surveyor of the road in the room of the Minor Wynn and ordered that he keep the same in repair with the Male Labouring tithables working thereon and that he Erect posts or stones where necessary according to law.

Noted in the margin was "Negroes freedom."
