



Transplanting Tips



Transplants will need that stored energy to acclimate to the garden – expanding its roots and growing more leaves – not producing fruit.

Transplanting can cause transplant shock, which will temporarily stunt a plant's growth.






Tomatoes: Tomatoes can be planted deep. Remove some of the lower leaves and plant deeper than the rootball. Roots will grow from the buried stem.

Ideally, do not transplant on a hot, sunny day when plants are susceptible to heat stress.



Water in well after transplanting so that there is good contact between the transplant's root and the soil.
