4-H Project Records and Portfolios are a key element to experiential learning. You'll learn important life skills, such as organization, record keeping, communication, and more. You'll receive feedback so that you can improve each year, as well as

awards for outstanding effort. And you'll have a permanent document of your personal growth, memories, and how your 4-H Story has grown! <u>See Page 8 for more information.</u>

4-H Project Records and Portfolios are required to reach the highest levels in 4-H because they document and demonstrate your commitment to participation and leadership in 4-H. Turning in successful 4-H Project Records and Portfolios document necessary steps to apply for Virginia 4-H and National 4-H Ambassador Programs. Horse portfolios and Shooting Education portfolios are necessary to compete in state-level competitions. Scored 4-H Project Records and Portfolios are also required for the Virginia 4-H All Star Application.

And if you didn't complete a 4-H Project Record or Portfolio this year, be sure to attend the fall training session so that you don't miss out on this important opportunity!

Trigger Time is a Prince William 4-H Shooting Education Program that uses shooting as a vehicle to teach youth life skills such as responsibility, self discipline, and teamwork. Youth learn marksmanship and the safe and responsible use of firearms through the 4-H Project. The focus of all 4-H programs is the development of youth as individuals and as responsible and productive citizens. The activities of the program, and the support of caring adult leaders, provide young people with opportunities to develop life skills, self-worth, and conservation ethics.

MEETINGS: Shotgun & Skeet/Trap: every Monday at 4pm at the Fairfax Rod and Gun Club Air Pistol, Air Rifle, & BB: every Monday at 6:30 pm at the Army National Guard Archery: every Monday at 6:30 pm at the Prince William Izaak Walton League *Summer meetings are held at a member's farm for smallbore, archery and muzzleloader.

4-H CLUB FEES: Annual club dues are \$25 and cover meeting space, sport supplies, and local matches. Travel matches (Spring Air, Districts, States, and Nationals) are an additional fee and are offset by club fundraising.

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4-H PROJECTS & PORTFOLIOS A creative method for youth to document their experiences

Prince William 4-H

LEARN BY DOING

Prince William 4-H'ers document their experiences and work each year by using age-appropriate 4-H Project Record Forms. These records are submitted to Prince William 4-H for review and are eligible to compete at the Prince William County Fair and county and state 4-H competitions. Projects begin October 1st and 4-H Project Records are due by the following September 30th. 4-H'ers may choose to submit a record of an individual project (Project Record) or their entire life history (Portfolio).

Ultimately, your 4-H Project Records will form an excellent summary of your 4-H career. You will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. Your 4-H Portfolio may become a personal scrapbook which will be cherished for many years.

STEPS FOR A 4-H PROJECT

- 1. Select at least one annual project based on interests.
- 2. Complete at least 6 learning experiences/ activities (typically found in published 4-H project books).
- 3. Record and analyze your learning experience by tracing your progress and emphasizing life skills gained by using the 4-H Project Record form.
- 4. Submit the completed Project Record to Prince William 4-H for review and scoring against a rubric to see how much you've grown!

WHAT IS A 4-H PORTFOLIO?

Portfolios are a record of the life achievement of a 4-H'er. They create a record of accomplishments which can be very helpful when youth are applying for college and scholarship opportunities. They may include material not directly related to 4-H and should be organized by year. Portfolios consist of multiple years of work (except for first time submissions).

Some projects, such as animal projects, shooting education, and archery, have specialized 4-H Project Books that must be completed and submitted prior to participating in 4-H contests for those activities in order to establish basic knowledge, level of experience, and safety.

• Helping to plan and implement the Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Summit (date will be determined by the Ambassador team).

- Helping to write and edit the quarterly Buzz, Body, and Bites Newsletter for Teens.
- Embodying the role of a Healthy Living Ambassador by being the youth voice in your community to advocate for healthy living.
- Informing 4-H youth, volunteers, and other interested persons about 4-H Healthy Living opportunities and resources.
- Sharing program ideas and resources with peers that will help strengthen and expand 4-H Healthy Living programs.
- Representing 4-H in a positive manner.

To qualify to serve as a Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Ambassador, you must:

- Be a teen 4-H member (between the ages of 14-18) and active in 4HOnline.
- Have a passion for and active engagement in 4-H Healthy Living.
- Have an interest in sharing knowledge to enhance youth educational experiences.
- Be willing to be a team player working with local, district, and state level professionals to share resources and opportunities.
- Be able to communicate effectively both written and verbally.

The benefits one will receive by becoming a Healthy Living Ambassador includes:

- Enhancing your 4-H Healthy Living understanding and skills.
- Networking with peers and healthy living leaders around the state and nation.
- Assisting in moving forward the 4-H Healthy Living mission.
- Enhancing your professional development opportunities.

2024 State Fair of Virginia Youth Livestock Shows Updates

Click here for Rules and Updates. A culminating event for youth livestock projects, the Youth Livestock Shows allow youth to exhibit their cattle, sheep, meat goats, and swine and compete in showmanship.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK PROMOTIONAL DISPLAY COMPETITION: The purpose of the Youth Livestock Promotional Display Competition is to allow exhibitors to create and share an educational display that focuses on a topic or area of interest for the species industry that they are representing. Displays should be self-explanatory and provide education and knowledge to general fairgoers, as well as the judges who will evaluate the displays. There is no Entry Fee, but pre-entry is REQUIRED. Entry for Promotional Displays is collected through the FairEntry System when you complete your animal entries.

YQCA TRAINING: All youth who participate in the 2024 State Fair of Virginia Youth Livestock Shows are required to have completed their annual YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) Training no later than August 31, 2024. This annual training must be an in-person, instructor-led training and must be completed between October 15, 2023 and August 31, 2024.

Virginia 4-H - Host a College Student from Chile!



Virginia 4-H has created a new 4-H exchange program with Chile. The Virginia 4-H Chile Exchange program is hosting three exchange delegates (1 female and 2 males) from Chile from September 26, 2024 – December 2, 2024. Participants are 18 years of age. All of the exchange delegates are attending agriculture schools in Chile and are interested in our education system, culture, and daily life, and they want to improve language skills.

VIRGINIA Host families are needed for each of these delegates. Ideally, families host for 2-3 weeks each. Host families treat the exchange delegate as one of the family members. They should make a conscious effort to help the delegate feel comfortable around friends and include them in activities. It would be good for the exchange delegates to visit some of our schools,

learn about our education system, the agriculture programs in our schools as well as about the Career and Technical Education programs. Efforts should be made to include them in some 4-H meetings, programs and activities during their stay. Families will need to assign a bed exclusively to the delegate for the duration of the stay and will need to provide three meals a day. Host families do not have to be farm families.

Why do families serve as host families? It's a great opportunity to:

- Learn about another country
- Learn about another culture and customs while sharing about ours.
- Represent the United States, Virginia, Virginia 4-H and your county/city 4-H program.
- Develop intercultural competencies and cross-cultural communication skills
- Give an international visitor an unforgettable experience.
- Improve language skills
- Build lifelong friendships

Junior Collectors: Ages 8 to 13 Senior Collectors: Ages 14 to 18 Any individual, team, or group is eligible. Group or team entries are encouraged. Individuals within groups can contribute their best specimens to the collections, which is judged as a team entry.

Winners: Collections will be awarded first, second, and third place in each age category based on the scoring guidelines. The top collection will be awarded "Best in Show" and will receive a grand prize. All participants and their collections will receive recognition!

Suggested Supplies:

Foam, pins, magnifying glass, and killing jar (a mason jar with a paper towel and a little nail polish remover works well). Make sure to pin insects from your kill jar right away or store them in the freezer until you are ready to pin them.
