# Wrapping Up Your 4-H Year - Portfolios Due October 1st!

Start working TODAY on finalizing your 4-H Project Records and Portfolios! Prince William 4-H has lots of support to help you complete these - from forms, to ideas, to templates, and more...be sure to reach out with any questions!

4-H Project Records and Portfolios are a key element to experiential learning. You'll learn important life skills, such as organization, record keeping, communication, and more. You'll receive feedback so that you can improve each year, as well as awards for outstanding effort. And you'll have a permanent document of your personal growth, memories, and how your 4-H Story has grown! See Page 4 for more information.

4-H Project Records and Portfolios are required to reach the highest levels in 4-H because they document and demonstrate your commitment to participation and leadership in 4-H. Turning in successful 4-H Project Records and Portfolios document necessary steps to apply for Virginia 4-H and National 4-H Ambassador Programs. Horse portfolios and Shooting Education portfolios are necessary to compete in state-level competitions. Scored 4-H Project Records and Portfolios are also required for the Virginia 4-H All Star Application.

And if you didn't complete a 4-H Project Record or Portfolio this year, be sure to attend the fall training session so that you don't miss out on this important opportunity!

As a Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Ambassador, meeting virtually once a month, participants will work together to plan a statewide 4-H Healthy Living Summit as well as develop the quarterly Buzz, Body, and Bites newsletter for teens. Specifically, the expectations for serving in this role include:

- Actively participating in monthly meetings (date and time will be determined as a group after Ambassadors are selected). More
  frequent meetings may be needed as we get closer to the Healthy Living Summit.
- Helping to plan and implement the Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Summit (date will be determined by the Ambassador team).
- Helping to write and edit the quarterly Buzz, Body, and Bites Newsletter for Teens.
- Embodying the role of a Healthy Living Ambassador by being the youth voice in your community to advocate for healthy living.
- Informing 4-H youth, volunteers, and other interested persons about 4-H Healthy Living opportunities and resources.
- Sharing program ideas and resources with peers that will help strengthen and expand 4-H Healthy Living programs.
- Representing 4-H in a positive manner.

To qualify to serve as a Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Ambassador, you must:

- Be a teen 4-H member (between the ages of 14-18) and active in 4HOnline.
- Have a passion for and active engagement in 4-H Healthy Living.
- Have an interest in sharing knowledge to enhance youth educational experiences.
- Be willing to be a team player working with local, district, and state level professionals to share resources and opportunities.
- Be able to communicate effectively both written and verbally.

The benefits one will receive by becoming a Healthy Living Ambassador includes:

- Enhancing your 4-H Healthy Living understanding and skills.
- Networking with peers and healthy living leaders around the state and nation.
- Assisting in moving forward the 4-H Healthy Living mission.
- Enhancing your professional development opportunities.

Prince William 4-H'ers document their experiences and work each year by using age-appropriate 4-H Project Record Forms. These records are submitted to Prince William 4-H for review and are eligible to compete at the Prince William County Fair and county and state 4-H competitions. Projects begin October 1st and 4-H Project Records are due by the following September 30th, 4-H'ers may choose to submit a record of an individual project (Project Record) or their entire life history (Portfolio).

Ultimately, your 4-H Project Records will form an excellent summary of your 4-H career. You will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. Your 4-H Portfolio may become a personal scrapbook which will be cherished for many years.

#### **STEPS FOR A 4-H PROJECT**

- 1. Select at least one annual project based on interests.
- 2. Complete at least 6 learning experiences/ activities (typically found in published 4-H project books).
- 3. Record and analyze your learning experience by tracing your progress and emphasizing life skills gained by using the 4-H Project Record form.
- 4. Submit the completed Project Record to Prince William 4-H for review and scoring against a rubric to see how much you've grown!

#### WHAT IS A 4-H PORTFOLIO?

Portfolios are a record of the life achievement of a 4-H'er. They create a record of accomplishments which can be very helpful when youth are applying for college and scholarship opportunities. They may include material not directly related to 4-H and should be organized by year. Portfolios consist of multiple years of work (except for first time submissions).

Some projects, such as animal projects, shooting education, and archery, have specialized 4-H Project Books that must be completed and submitted prior to participating in 4-H contests for those activities in order to establish basic knowledge, level of experience, and safety.

A culminating event for youth livestock projects, the Youth Livestock Shows allow youth to exhibit their cattle, sheep, meat goats, and swine and compete in showmanship.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK PROMOTIONAL DISPLAY COMPETITION: The purpose of the Youth Livestock Promotional Display Competition is to allow exhibitors to create and share an educational display that focuses on a topic or area of interest for the species industry that they are representing. Displays should be self-explanatory and provide education and knowledge to general fairgoers, as well as the judges who will evaluate the displays. There is no Entry Fee, but pre-entry is REQUIRED. Entry for Promotional Displays is collected through the Fair Entry System when you complete your animal entries.

# Virginia 4-H - Host a College Student from Chile!



Virginia 4-H has created a new 4-H exchange program with Chile. The Virginia 4-H Chile Exchange program is hosting three exchange delegates (I female and 2 males) from Chile from September 26, 2024 – December 2, 2024. Participants are 18 years of age. All of the exchange delegates are attending agriculture schools in Chile and are interested in our education system, culture, and daily life, and they want to improve language skills.

VIRGINIA Host families are needed for each of these delegates. Ideally, families host for 2-3 weeks each. Host families treat the exchange delegate as one of the family members. They should make a conscious effort to help the delegate feel comfortable around friends and include them in activities. It would be good for the exchange delegates to visit some of our schools, learn about our education system, the agriculture programs in our schools as well as about the Career and Technical Education programs. Efforts should be made to include them in some 4-H meetings, programs and activities during their stay. Families will need to assign a bed exclusively to the delegate for the duration of the stay and will need to provide three meals a day. Host families do not have to be farm families.

Why do families serve as host families? It's a great opportunity to:

- Learn about another country
- Learn about another culture and customs while sharing about ours.
- Represent the United States, Virginia, Virginia 4-H and your county/city 4-H program.
- Develop intercultural competencies and cross-cultural communication skills
- Give an international visitor an unforgettable experience.
- Improve language skills
- Build lifelong friendships




4-H Clubs are open to youth ages 5-19. They can be established in-school, after school, or as independent clubs, and can be teacher or volunteer led.

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# PRINCE WILLIAM 4-H COMPETITIONS

Through Prince William 4-H, youth are provided opportunities to develop their unique talents and capabilities. In 4-H, we "Learning by Doing." 4-H provides opportunities for both training (learning) and practice (doing). Through competitions, 4'H'ers develop life skills that are relevant now and in the future. Youth who develop life skills become self-directed, productive, contributing citizens.



# LEARNING COMPETITIONS

4-H programming with youth is guided by an experiential learning process that includes goal setting, cognition, practice, and performance. The performance stage is when members demonstrate what they have learned through various 4-H activities and events, including competitions. Youth are scored against a published rubric. competition experiences enhance positive youth development and prepare youth with positive competitive knowledge, skills, attitudes, and aspirations that can lead to success through life.

# SHARE THE FUN & PRESENTATIONS

Share-the-Fun and Presentation Day are our most popular competitions and encourage 4-H'ers to display their talents in expressive arts and develop presentation skills and confidence performing in front of an audience. Judges evaluate 4-H performers based on talent, audience response, creativity, showmanship, and use of costumes/props. The goal is to help participants develop their talents in a creative and constructive manner, develop research and writing skills, learn computer skills, and improve communication skills. Competition categories include: presentations, extemporaneous speech, public speech, drama, dramatic reading, table setting, fashion review, science fair, radio and public address, and vocal-instrumentalcombo performance.



# PROJECT RECORDS & PORTFOLIOS

4-H Project Records form an excellent summary of a 4-H'ers career. Youth will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. 4-H Portfolios combine all 4-H experiences over the lifetime of the member. Both Project Records and portfolios are submitted annually to Prince William 4-H for scoring. Special interest clubs, such as horse and shooting education, require project records and portfolios prior to competing.

A variety of 4-H competitions and events are available for youth to practice and perfect the life skills they learn through their projects.

# DOING COMPETITIONS

Team competitions provide opportunities for youth to develop the interpersonal. leadership and cooperative skills necessary to be successful in our interdependent and global society. Teams and individuals may progress from local to district, state, and national competitions.

4-H Food Challenge: 4-H teams learn kitchen and cooking safety, how to prepare nutritious meals and snacks, and key concepts of healthy living. Learning experiences focus on nutrition, food purchasing, food preparation, food safety, and related careers.

4-H Shooting Education & Sports: This program uses shooting as a vehicle to teach youth life skills such as responsibility, self discipline, and teamwork. Firearm Safety and marksmanship are also taught using the disciplines of shotgun, skeet/trap, air pistol, air rifle, BB, small bore, muzzleloader, and archery.

4-H Horse Competitions: Virginia's 4-H horse program emphasizes project based learning about equine selection, nutrition, management, riding, recreation, fun, competition, horsemanship, and sportsmanship. Competitions focus on hippology and horsemanship.

4-H Livestock Competitions: This animal science project enables youth to develop their interests in beef cattle, sheep, meat goats and swine. 4-H'ers learn about selection, care and feeding of livestock, animal health, and the importance of good record keeping. Competitions are available in livestock judging and stockmen's contests, and livestock shows.

Any individual, team, or group is eligible. Group or team entries are encouraged. Individuals within groups can contribute their best specimens to the collections, which is judged as a team entry.

#### Suggested Supplies:

Foam, pins, magnifying glass, and killing jar (a
