- 1. Team interactions Wade
 - a. Meeting decorum should be professional when interacting with each other and the consultants

2. Team check-in

- a. Kathy The residents' experience thus far is that some assumptions have been made and bureaucratic process along the way has been slow. So, she felt a comment needed to be made to address that early on.
- 3. Discuss the status of the draft Noise Ordinance
 - i. Presentation from the resident members of the group. This will be sent out to the group.
 - ii. Discussion about how the SOW was created
 - iii. Discussion about using dBC instead of dBA
 - iv. Discussion about enforcement
 - v. Maximum allowable sound levels need to come down
 - Need to verify if the Noise Ordinance in Warrenton is in litigation
 - vi. Discussion about Moseley presentation
 - Discussion about peer communities and how they were determined
 - 2. Some of the Zoning classifications may need to be changed.
 - vii. The group agreed we should move forward with more changes to the current Noise Ordinance in the interim, until the state laws can be changed.
- 4. Project timeline Wade
 - a. Status related to hiring of 3rd party acoustical engineer
 - i. Nelson Acoustics will be brought on board to be a 3rd party advisor/expert in relation to the Noise Ordinance
 - 1. A link for the company will be sent to the group
 - 2. Nelson should be able to begin work on September 3.

- b. Community Meeting Discussion
 - i. The group agreed that we are not ready to host a community meeting at this time.
 - ii. Do we need the community meeting?
 - 1. The BOCS Work Session and/or the Public Hearing at the BOCS Meeting could serve as an opportunity for the public to hear it and make comments, in place of the community meeting.
 - iii. There is concern about the draft appearing to be a finalized draft and that it does not fully solve the problem. The parameters/restrictions on the state laws should be explained to the community when the draft is presented to them.
 - 1. JLARC will be presenting to the state legislature as well with their findings and recommendations for changes to the state laws.
 - 2. If we have a community meeting, the interim solution needs to be presented and discussed, as well as what the plan is for a long term solution if/when the state laws change.
- c. Overall project timeline related to the Noise Ordinance
 - Sunset clause expires at the end of February, so we either need to plan on asking for an extension to the sunset clause or have a draft Noise Ordinance ready to present for potential Board adoption.
 - ii. It is possible there will be a 4-6 week delay in the project timeline
- 5. Future meeting schedule
 - a. Cancel the August 28 meeting, as JMT will not be ready to present
 - b. Next scheduled meeting is September 11 meeting JMT will be ready to present, and Nelson Acoustics will be there as well.
