October 21, 2024. This past week, Trigger Time played Bradley Central AJROTC for their third game in the National Sporter Air Rifle League. Though it was a close match, Trigger Time posted their first loss of the season: Bradley Central with 1109.2 and Trigger Time with a score of 1094.4. The contributing team members were Rebecca Ahrens (287.7), Lexi Strand (271.1), Tanner Ridings (270.9), and Noah Richter (264.7). At present, Trigger Time is ranked sixteenth in the league and second under Junior Rifle Club teams. Tanner Ridings and Noah Richter tied for the top shots in the standing position, both hitting a 10.3. Setting personal records for their highest aggregate scores of this season were Charley Murphy and Koa Mintz. This coming week Trigger Time will face their local Virginia rivals, Lafayette Gun Club.

- * Youth MUST be enrolled before participating in ANY 4-H club, activity, or event. No exceptions. This includes 4-H camps, counselor applications, scholarship applications, horse program, shooting education, all competitions, community service, etc. DO NOT WAIT to enroll.
- * Enroll by NOVEMBER 1st to continue to receive the Prince William 4-H Newsletter.

The State 4-H Office is once again pleased to announce this exciting award opportunity for 4-H'ers across Virginia. To provide a similar system to the National 4-H Youth in Action Awards, and to encourage high quality applications for the national awards, the State 4-H Office established the Virginia 4-H Youth in Action Awards Program in 2019. The nomination process is now open for our Class of 2025 Youth in Action winners.

ALL PRINCE WILLIAM 4-H ELIGIBLE YOUTH ARE ENCOURAGED TO SUBMIT AN **APPLICATION FOR AN AWARD!**

This year's process is similar to last year in that the youth themselves may apply directly for the award. However, they are still required to obtain a letter of reference from their Extension Agent. Youth may recommend themselves for consideration in one or more of the pillar areas of Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. One pillar winner will be chosen from each area. Any 4-H member in Virginia ages 15-18 is eligible to be nominated.

Each of the four winners will receive:

- A \$500 mini-grant to their Unit to develop a significant community project.
- Recognition at An Evening with Virginia 4-H in January 2025
- A full scholarship to attend Virginia 4-H State Congress in June 2025, in Blacksburg, VA.
- An opportunity to be featured as the Virginia 4-H Youth Spokesperson for their pillar area.
- An opportunity to represent Virginia 4-H at a national event for their pillar area.
- Support and mentorship to apply for the 2026 National 4-H Youth in Action Awards.
- An official reference letter from the Virginia State 4-H Program Leader, Jeremy C. Johnson
