Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club Narrowly Defeats Missouri Military Academy

November 27, 2024. In the final match in the National Sporter Air Rifle League, Trigger Time narrowly defeated Missouri Military Academy with a score of 1095.2 to 1093.1. The contributing team members this week were Rebecca Ahrens (287.9), Lexi Strand (284.8), Tanner Ridings (271.3), and Ayden Strand (251.2). The top standing shots of the week were Ayden Strand (10.5) and Rebecca Ahrens (10.4). Completing the season with a record of 3-4, Trigger Time ranked 23rd of 120 teams in the league, and 4th under Junior Rifle Clubs.

A total of sixteen athletes competed from Trigger Time this season. The team member with the most improvement in aggregate score from her first match to her last, was Sophie Carter. Holding the record for the highest single standing shot of the season was Ayden Strand with a 10.7. Rebecca Ahrens had the highest average aggregate score (288.5). Congratulations to all of the athletes who participated in the league.

This six-month (virtual and self-paced) environmental science program offers university and high school students an in-depth exploration of honeybees and beekeeping through a combination of theoretical study, research opportunities, and hands-on experiences. Whether or not you intend to pursue beekeeping, this course provides a captivating lens through which to understand the cultural, historical, and environmental roles of honeybees. For those aspiring to become beekeepers, this program offers the chance to work alongside an experienced beekeeper, serving as a valuable introduction to the practicalities of beekeeping. Additionally, participants will be well-prepared to mentor novice beekeepers and potentially manage apiary activities on a local farm. There will also be virtual visits with beekeepers around the world. The program culminates with visits to Virginia apiaries where students will engage directly with bees and observe hive behavior in action and also including a pinning ceremony/celebration. This immersive experience bridges classroom learning with real-world practice, offering students a comprehensive understanding of both the science and practice of beekeeping.





#Embryology Project#

"The Beginning of Life" 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. Educational material address Virginia SOLs for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. Prince William 4-H provides fertilized eggs, guides participants through training, supports participants during the hatch, and then collects the chicks to be sent to a local farm.

Prince William 4-H Clubs, Prince William County Schools, Manassas City Schools, Manassas Park Schools, and Homeschool Groups are invited to participate in this exciting 4-H project!




AG IT UP YOUTH POSTER CONTEST





The Department of Parks & Recreation, (DPR) is a fun, experiential learning atmosphere that is centered on excellent programming, customer service, and community at the Gro Preschool at James S. Long Park. We strive for excellence in the workplace within an environment that fosters creativity and learning. The

Department of Parks & Recreation is seeking a PART-TIME, BENEFITTED Head Children's Leader who is a highly motivated and enthusiastic individual to teach children's preschool programs for children ages 3 - 5 and summer camps ages 3-8.



Gro Preschool is a Natural Education Space, incorporating both indoor and outdoor classrooms. The outdoor classroom will have a variety of stations for preschoolers to explore music, movement, gardening, and the natural world around them. The outdoor classroom provides an environment for children to collaborate, be inquisitive and promotes a lifelong connection and appreciation to the children's natural surroundings.

This program is Virginia State licensed; therefore, the Head Children's Leader is responsible for ensuring compliance with the regulations pertaining to the Department of Social Services and best practices of early childhood education. The Head Children's Leader is responsible for the health, safety, and welfare of the children they are assigned to.

ABOUT THIS ROLE: This is a supervisor leadership-level position that is responsible for supervising, leading, and supporting subordinate staff members and department operations. Reports to our full time Recreation Specialist working with and administering licensed and non-licensed children's programs. This position is located at the Gro Preschool at James S. Long Park.

THE HEAD CHILDREN'S LEADER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- Delivering well-planned, high-quality preschool programs and summer camps. Programs are planned and implemented through
 collaboration with the Children Leaders and Recreation Specialist, review of current registration and surveys to better
 understand the needs of the programs.
- Developing and evaluating lesson plans in accordance with program curriculum. Maximizes employee performance and program effectiveness.
- Ensuring quality guest interactions. Parents, students, and staff are treated respectfully and timely. They feel their concerns have been heard and addressed fairly.
- Establishing policies within the class to ensure safety and security of staff and patrons. Monitor patron and staff injury and accident logs and follow up on how we can fix the issue.
- Ensuring all staff receive training on safety protocols and policies and procedures for the Gro Preschool building, and outdoor spaces. Monitor to ensure all are being followed and documented.
- Maintaining compliance with all state licensing requirements.


