RE: FUNDING IN THE FY26 BUDGET FOR TRAILS

ACTION:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Supervisors is presently considering allocations of funding for the FY26 CIP budget; and

WHEREAS, the most recent Parks Facilities Needs Assessment (2019) identified trails as the public's most desired recreational facility and water access points as the public's 2nd most desired facility; and

WHEREAS, the Mobility Chapter and the Countywide Trail Plan of the Comprehensive Plan was approved by the Board in December of 2022 and identifies future bicycle and pedestrian needs countywide, and

WHEREAS, the Mobility Chapter promotes bicycle and pedestrian facilities that increase multimodal connectivity, safety, and recreational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Mobility Chapter prioritizes bicycle and pedestrian projects which provide increased connectivity to schools, parks, and other community destinations; and

WHEREAS, In the Community Energy and Sustainability Master plan that was adopted by the Board on October 24, 2023, the goal of "Improving pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure and enhancing connectivity" was cited as a High Priority Action Item; and

WHEREAS, Adequate and consistent funding is needed in order to realize progress with the above stated goals; and

WHEREAS, Trails and Blueways Council members have identified a high priority list of trails and blueways projects including many from the Countywide Trail Plan spread across all magisterial districts that address the above stated goals (see attachment);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Trails and Blueways Council, recommends that the County's Board of Supervisors, in conjunction with recommendations from the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Transportation, identify funding for a variety of trail projects across all magisterial districts in the FY2026 CIP.
