


# WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR TRASH

## WHAT GOES IN THE TRASH CONTAINER

### EVERYDAY TRASH & PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM

- 
- Restroom & kitchen tissue
  - Other paper goods contaminated with food and/or grease
  - Food waste
  - Non-recyclable plastics & metals
  - Disposable gloves & masks
  - Other miscellaneous day-to-day waste
  - Plastic bags, packaging & other stretchy wrapping materials (Plastic bags and packaging can be returned to some grocery and retail stores)
  - Snack bags



## WHAT GOES IN THE RECYCLE CONTAINER



### PAPER

Junkmail, office paper, newspaper, magazines, paper bags, postcards, paperback books



### PAPERBOARD

Paper towel/toilet paper rolls, boxes, egg cartons



### PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS & JARS

Beverage, shampoo, bodywash, condiments, detergents, cleaning products



### CARDBOARD

Flattened & placed inside of cart; No foam/plastic packaging or soiled food boxes



### TIN/ALUMINUM CANS

**NO** detached can lids, aerosol cans or other metal items of any kind



**NO PLASTIC BAGS IN YOUR RECYCLING CART!**

**BAGGED RECYCLING IS PROHIBITED**

## SPECIAL WASTE THAT DOES NOT GO IN THE TRASH

### HAZARDOUS WASTE



Paints and coatings, chemicals and solvents, lead-acid and lithium batteries, electronic waste, fluorescent bulbs & light tubes, pesticides and herbicides, aerosol cans, medical waste, acids and bases, oils and lubricants.

### CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS



Asbestos-containing materials, contaminated soil, wood, concrete and brick, roofing materials and insulation materials.

### YARD WASTE, TIRES & SCRAP METAL



### GLASS BOTTLES, JUGS & JARS



Take to designated purple bin locations
