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Prince William 4-H Portfolio Training



On January 30th, Prince William 4-H held Portfolio Training at headquarters to set our 4-H'ers up for a successful year, documenting their experiences and growing their 4-H Story. Record keeping is a critical component of 4-H and is required for certain projects, such as equestrian and shooting sports. Portfolios are also required for advanced recognitions in 4-H, such as ambassadors, state and national Youth in Action Awards, and Virginia All Stars. Portfolios are also a reference when building your 4-H, college, and career resumes.



The 4-H'ers attending the training reviewed the record books and portfolios from former Prince William 4-H youth to find inspiration. We learned that in Maria Konstanty's Cloverbud portfolio, she wanted to become her club

treasurer. Today, she reached that goal and serves as Treasurer of the Nokesville 4-H Club with a new goal to become the VP of her club in two years. Great work, Maria!

VA 4-H Day at the Capitol: Voice Your Choice






VIRGINIA 4-H DAY AT THE CAPITOL VOICE YOUR CHOICE

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Youth & Volunteer Applications: 2025 VA 4-H Dominican Republic Program

The Virginia 4-H Program in the Dominican Republic is now accepting applications from Virginia 4-H teens and 4-H volunteers! This program started as a grassroots, county based program, which is now in its 17th year. It has been open to 4-H'ers statewide for a few years now. During 2025, Christine Hodges and I will be taking two different 4-H teen groups to the Dominican Republic for one week each. Applications are open to all 9th-12th grade 4-H teens in Virginia. Since one main focus of our program

in the Dominican Republic is conducting a 4-H Day Camp for Dominican children, this program may especially appeal to your 4-H Camp Counselors. A recommendation from the 4-H delegate's Extension Agent or Program Assistant is a required part of the application, and it is their responsibility to ask you for that recommendation and follow up to be sure it is submitted.

The deadline to apply is February 25, 2025, but we would appreciate receiving applications sooner if possible. Applications will be reviewed and the participants will be notified in early March if they are selected or are on a waiting list. The program cost is \$2,600, with \$1,000 of that due as a deposit on March 17. If they don't have a passport, they should gather the needed documents now and be prepared to apply for a passport as soon as they receive notice that they are accepted for the program. Receiving a passport is a slow, but important process. They cannot board the plane without a passport.

We will also be able to accept a couple of Adult 4-H Volunteers for this program. Click here for the ADULT APPLICATION. Current 4-H volunteer enrollment and three reference letters are required for adult applicants.

100% of the families agree that the 2023 summer inbound exchange was a positive experience for their family.

- Our delegates will all come from Japan this summer and they will all be members of a group called Labo that is similar to 4-H. It is our goal to host 20 youth delegates and 2 adult chaperones.
- To host a youth delegate, a host family must have a child that will serve as a host sibling. The
 host siblings need to be within 4 years of age of a delegate. Last year our delegates were all in
 the 13-16 year old age range.
- Families who do not have children can host adult chaperones. We will have 2 adult chaperones in 2025 and will need at least 2 host families for these chaperones.
- Families must have an adult home most of the time during the exchange period. This opportunity
 will not work for families where all of the adults work outside of the home at the same time.

Each spring, VCC sponsors the Virginia Institute on Cooperative Education, a leadership conference to educate high school juniors and seniors about cooperatives and the co-op form of business through interactive instruction that includes a live simulation, "Who's Minding the Store?" Students gain teamwork, leadership, and communication skills, with top performers having the opportunity to receive up to \$2,000 in educational scholarships.




Student applicants are required to choose a cooperative business in Virginia and contact a staff member to learn more about the size and operation of this cooperative in their community. To be considered for college scholarships, students will complete a test based on the "Welcome to Cooperatives" manual and be evaluated on participation in activities during VICE, including the "Who's Minding the Store" team simulation.

VICE evaluations consistently report that students find the conference fun and educational. They often write that they came to the conference knowing nothing about co-ops but leave with a fuller appreciation of this unique business form. They also provide positive feedback on the opportunity to make new friends and enjoy great food in a scenic rural setting. In recent years, 100% of participants said they would recommend VICE to a friend.




