Sustainability Goals

- Reduce Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions 50% by 2030
- Become Climate Ready by 2030
- ✓ 100% Renewable Energy for County Operations by 2030
- ✓ 100% Countywide Renewable Electricity by 2035
- ✓ Carbon Neutral Government by 2050

Key Recommendations

Analyzed Data Center Impact: Warned that emissions are set to quadruple by 2030. Suggested solutions for clean energy.

Policy & Planning: Integrate sustainability into the Comprehensive Plan and land-use decisions.

♦ **Groundwater Study Approved**: Sustainable water management.

GHG Emission Assessments: Proposed evaluating emissions for all new residential developments.

Long-Term Resource Planning: Helped Sustainability Office draft a budget plan to meet climate goals.

Smart Growth for Transit: Advocated for 75% of new homes near high-capacity transit to reduce emissions.

Solar Energy Review: Provided guidance on balancing solar expansion with environmental concerns.



Resilient Future

Clean air, fresh water, and green spaces improve our wellbeing and ensures safe environment for future generations

Challenges

A GHG Emissions Rising Instead of Falling – Driven by data center growth, PWC risks missing all climate goals and affecting the entire region.

Energy Demand Growing Faster Than Clean Energy Supply – Without stronger policies, 100% renewable electricity is slipping away.

Lack of Leadership & Integration – The CESMP is not fully embraced in county operations beyond the Sustainability Office.

Low Public Awareness & Engagement – Citizens & businesses need to take action but lack information.

Budget Shortfall – The county doesn't have enough funds allocated to fully implement climate plans.
