Updates

Armed Robbery *ARREST – On March 29, the suspect sought in connection to a robbery that was reported to have occurred at the 7-Eleven located at 17360 Dumfries Rd. in Dumfries (22026) on March 7, was arrested. During the investigation, Dumfries police identified the suspect as Deontae Terrell **GALITAN** and obtained charges. On March 29, following the investigation, the accused was served while incarcerated at the Rappahannock Regional Adult Detention Center for unrelated charges.

Armed Robbery [Previously Released] – On March 7 at 2:40AM, officers responded to the 7-Eleven located at 17360 Dumfries Rd. in Dumfries (22026) to investigate a robbery. The investigation revealed an unknown man brandished a firearm and took money from the cash register before leaving the area. No injuries were reported. Officers and a police K-9 searched the area for the suspect who was not located. An undisclosed amount of money was reported missing.

Brandishing of a Firearm – On April 1 at 7:25PM, officers responded to the area of Winchester Ct. near Irongate Way in Manassas (20109) to investigate a brandishing. The investigation revealed the victim, a 17-year-old male juvenile, was walking in the above area when he was approached by two masked male suspects, possibly juveniles. During the encounter, one of the suspects brandished a firearm. After a brief verbal interaction, the parties separated. No shots were fired, and no injuries were reported. The suspects were described as wearing all dark-colored clothing.

Vandalism on School Grounds – On March 28 at 11:56AM, the School Resource Officer assigned to Patriot High School located at 10504 Kettle Run Rd. in Nokesville (20181) was made aware of vandalism found inside a school. The investigation revealed a swastika was found drawn in a classroom dictionary on March 26. The drawing was recently observed and reported to school personnel. The drawing did not appear to contain any threats towards students or staff. No additional markings were reported.
